LAMENTATIONS 3:1-11

1 am the man who has seen affliction under the 'rod of his wrath; **2**he has driven and brought me into darkness without any light; **3** surely against me he turns his hand again and again the whole day long. **4**He has made my flesh and my skin waste away; he has broken my bones; **5**he has besieged and enveloped me with bitterness and tribulation; 6he has made me dwell in darkness like the dead of long ago. **7**He has walled me about so that ^sI cannot escape; he has made my chains heavy; **8**though ^tI call and cry for help, he shuts out my prayer; **9**he has blocked my ways with blocks of stones; he has made my paths crooked. **10**He is a bear lying in wait for me, a lion in hiding; **11**he turned aside my steps and ^utore me to pieces; he has made me desolate

Driven- with a whip, like an animal Darkness- no light, fear, hopelessness; just the last place you want to go

vv. 2-11: who's hand has been turned against him? God's! how do we understand that?

1- we can certainly feel this way, like God isn't going to ever show up and help us

2- God will do what is necessary to purify and correct and draw us to himself

3- God doesn't abandon his own

Don't get all put out bc God did this!

This is an act of discipline and refining.

God's wrath against sin is necessary

His love for us is NOT necessary- he has chosen to love us!

Lamentations 3:19-20

20

19 Remember my affliction and my wanderings, the wormwood and the gall!

My soul continually remembers it and is bowed down within me.

Where's the encouragement; this book is just depressing!

This book (and others) gives us permission to hurt and grieve.

Christianity can't be a place where we have to bury our pain in order to fit in.

TSF must be a place where people can hurt, cry and seek the fullness of life in Jesus TOGETHER!

LAMENTATIONS 3:22-26

22 The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases

his mercies never come to an end;

23 they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

"The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."

The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him.

It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.

LAMENTATIONS 3:31-33

31 For the Lord will not cast off forever,

but, though he cause grief, he will have compassion according to the abundance of his steadfast love;

for he does not afflict from his heart or grieve the children of men.

In the pit and darkness, there is hidden mercy.

If we trust and lean on him, we see that it is not God's desire to hurt us.

He has a greater purpose and hidden mercies for us.

v. 24- portion= piece of the Promised Land

Its all gone; no land; no Jerusalem

THE LORD is my greatest blessing/possession/promise

Jesus is the better prize

Why would God do this?

We like it when God protects and promises and gives us stuff and Direction- but that's a childish love

God isn't satisfied with that!

So he brings struggles so have to dig deep to uproot childish faith and replace it with a deep thirst and longing for Jesus What do we learn from Job and Lamentations about suffering? God is good and in control and working all things for your purification

There's not always a direct correlation between your sin and your suffering

Sometimes your pain and loss is a direct result of your sin Satan is sometimes allowed to bring suffering and pain Our only hope is to trust in the Lord! Lower Application:

A very depressing morality story; "Work hard and be good or God will destroy you!"

Upper Application: There is REAL HOPE

Jesus hears our cries about our destruction and he weeps and is moved

And he dies to take away the destruction our sin brings!

Our hope is that Jesus is close to us, holding us, empowering us to overcome this broken world

This is real life- are you going to trust in Jesus while you are in the pit and darkness?

LAMENTATIONS 5:21

21Restore us to yourself, O Lord, that we may be restored! Renew our days as of old

LAMENTATIONS 3:55-59
