SERMON NOTES

HEBREWS 12:14-17; 24

- How many of us would say a lack of holiness is our biggest problem?
- Who is holy?
- Who is working on holiness?
- Who wants to be more holy?
- We are commanded to pursue it

HEBREWS 12:14-17

14 Pursue peace with all men, and the sanctification without which no one will see the Lord. 15 See to it that no one comes short of the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springing up causes trouble, and by it many be defiled; 16 that there be no immoral or godless person like Esau, who sold his own birthright for a single meal. 17 For you know that even afterwards, when he desired to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no place for repentance, though he sought for it with tears.

- Running the race is our practical, everyday living
- Personal holiness is closely connected to how we run our race
- There is imputed holiness and practical holiness
- Mind, Heart, Actions/body
- Holiness is aligning our life with what God says about the world; its directly related to faith
- We know what God says about reality because we have Scripture, where God has spoken authoritatively
- Holy has a root meaning of separate & set apart; how do we live that out separatism
- Set aside to be used by God
- Holiness is cutting ourselves out and setting ourselves aside so God can use us

Hebrews 12:14-17; 24

SERMON NOTES

HEBREWS 12:14-17; 24

- As we pursue holiness, everything in our lives gets examined
 - Unspoken, handed down biases
 - That's just how I am
 - That's how they are
- What is being examined now by the Spirit and the Word?
- What needs your examination?
 - What needs to be changed? EVERYTHING!
- What does it look like every day?
 - No one would confuse religion with grace
 - No one would be bitter about discipline or holiness
 - No one would live for today's pleasures instead of God's fulfillment
- We do this from joy and love

HEBREWS 12:14

14 Pursue peace with all men, and the sanctification without which no one will see the Lord.

- Why won't we see Jesus without holiness?
 - Experientially- a dry, boring, powerless daily walk with God
 - Eternally- if you're not being made more holy, are you saved?
 - Worshipfully- he gave everything for me, he deserves everything from me!

HEBREWS 12:24

24 and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood, which speaks better than the blood of Abel.

HEBREWS 12:14-17; 24

- We are reminded that we can run the race with holiness because Jesus has opened the way for us
- Abel's blood was spilled for God's promises that he hoped would be true
- Jesus' blood was spilled to insure that God's promises are true
- Where has the blood of Jesus been sprinkled?
 - Altar of Gods' mercy for our sins
 - On our hearts to cover our guilt
- Have you come to God through the blood of Jesus?
 - With no good in you
 - For daily holiness
- Will you run the race and pursue holiness with each other?

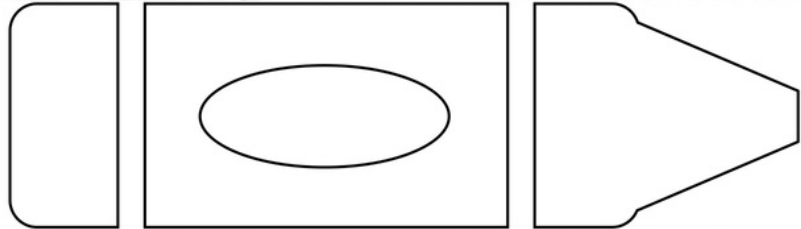

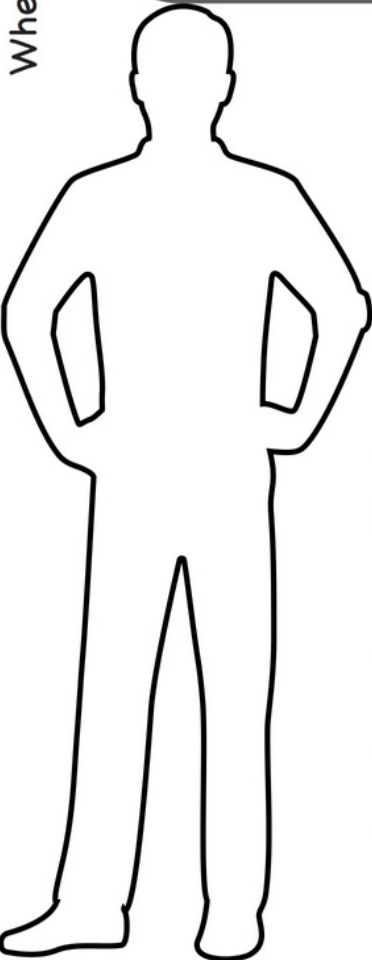
