But the Nintendo team was unable to get licensing rights to use Popeye characters, so they had to create an original storyline.

The hero in a red hat and overalls was later called Mario.

If Nintendo had gotten the rights to Popeye, it might have not created the most successful video game character in history.

It's a fun story about what might have been. Or what might not have been.
