














One Ring to rule them all, One Ring to find them, One Ring to bring them all and in the darkness bind them.

Psalm 115:4-7

Their idols are silver and gold, The work of man's hands. They have mouths, but they cannot speak;

They have eyes, but they cannot see;

They have ears, but they cannot hear;

They have noses, but they cannot smell;

They have hands, but they cannot feel;

They have feet, but they cannot walk;

They cannot make a sound with their throat...

<u>v. 8:</u>

Those who make them will become like them, Everyone who trusts in them.

- You are intimidated by people who aren't like you (1:9-10) and you compensate by mistreating (1:11-14) or sidelining (1:15-22) them.
- You punish unwanted expression through brute force and unreasonable expectations (5:10-14)
- You cannot allow for freedom of expression that you're not in the middle of or creativity that you didn't invent yourself (8:25, 28).
- You are willing to lose everything else except power (10:7) using people only for what they can do for you (14:5).

- You assume evil intentions on the part of those whose plans differ from yours (10:10).
- You move to manipulate people using their families (10:11) and possessions (10:24) when they don't fall in line.
- You view people only as means to an end and value.
