Update: God began putting it on our heart this past summer to move our family to Tsukuba, Ibaraki, Japan. This is a smaller city outside Tokyo, about two hours from where we currently live. Since moving to Japan almost four years ago, God has grown in us a heart to serve the Japanese pastors in our association (75+ Conservative Baptist churches). As God developed this vision in our hearts. He has led us to consider moving out of Tokyo to work with one of these churches. We have been working together with Pastor Sakuma and Tsukuba Grace Chapel several times over the past few years, bringing short-term teams and interns to work with his church. Pastor Sakuma is an influential new leader in our denomination who has a heart for local outreach and global missions. We pray that this move will help us better connect with all the churches and pastors as we hope to bring them encouragement and practical help through our short-termer program. We feel that this timing and new location will be good for our family for this next term of ministry. We pray God will help us grow in our language abilities through this primarily Japanese speaking context and that Japan will become our home even more.
