I am thrilled to send you this update about the current activities about the ministry. First and foremost i want to thank the TSF family for the love and support through the years. I also register the fact that we missed having a team come over this year! Hmnnn!

The education program is running quite okay. We are a little nervous sitting our first National recognized primary leaving exams this end of year. We have 23 registered for the exam (15 are sponsored) and we are doing our best to keep our performance steady.

With the new entrants, all our sponsored kids are attending school and doing their best to learn and become responsible persons. Thanks to all the sponsors for providing the opportunity for all the sponsored kids to be in school. Am currently thinking of a trip in 2027 to make some live connections with the new and old sponsors and for all us to get together and give thanks for the grace and impact that the program has had. It would be a great opportunity for a thanksgiving and drive to new engagements to grow this program.



The kids have been able to each write a letter to their sponsor and we've sent all the letters hope they come through alright!

We've not had major illness except for Kayizi Gideon C13 who has hernia which is being monitored and treated. We pray that he gets well!!

The school provides opportunity for athletics and sports and the pupils have been involved in inter schools competitions in soccer, netball, lacrosse and running. This time we did not win a trophy but we were among the top four good performers. Next time better.

The school still provides the meal a day for all sponsored kids and the kitchen department is doing well with the new kitchen donated by the 2025 TSF team that visited the school. The challenge with the feeding program is the escalating prices for food supplies that is making it costly especially that fact that the program does not have any emergency fund for such eventualities. The school garden is still an infant initiative and we have grown maize which is not yet ready for harvesting. We are looking for ways to turn the school farm into a real farm that can help provide good yields that can support the feeding program.

Church ministry is doing okay. We have ten locations that we are growing into real community churches. The journey is uphill and challenging especially on raising leaders but we are keeping up with the conviction to do God's work. Thanks for the pastoral support, it's indeed a real life line for the church ministry. Many of the leaders are doing a Bible training course to help them have a good handle on the word and church administration. Not many pastors here are trained.

Please know that we are so humbled and grateful to be connected with a loving and caring family at TSF and we continually give thanks to God for this divine connection.
