Not every conversation is worth having, and not every disagreement deserves our attention. In Titus 3:9–15, Paul teaches believers to avoid foolish arguments while pursuing lives that are useful, generous, and committed to doing what is good.

1. What makes some disagreements productive while others only create division?

LOOKING AT GOD'S WORD

Read Titus 3:9–15 together in the NIV.

2. What kinds of things does Paul tell Titus and the believers to avoid?
3. What does Paul instruct believers to do instead? What positive actions stand out in these verses?
4. What do verses 14–15 reveal about the kind of community Paul wants these believers to become?

DIGGING DEEPER

5. Why do you think Paul takes foolish arguments and divisive behavior so seriously?
6. What makes it difficult to know when to engage a disagreement and when to walk away from it?
7. Paul contrasts being unproductive with being devoted to doing what is good. What do you think that looks like in everyday life?

LIVING IT OUT

8. Are there conversations or disagreements that tend to pull you away from what is useful and constructive? How might you respond differently?
9. Where do you have an opportunity to be more intentional about doing something good for others?
10. What is one practical way you can contribute to a more peaceful, useful, and generous community this week?
