4. According to verses 9–10, how can a person's everyday work and behavior affect the way others view the teaching about God?

5. Why do you think Paul gives different instructions to different groups rather than giving everyone the same list of expectations?

6. Which quality or characteristic mentioned in this passage stands out to you most? Why?

7. What do you think Paul means by teaching that is "in accordance with sound doctrine"? How should what we believe affect the way we treat other people?

LIVING IT OUT

8. Which area of Christian character described in this passage do you most need to grow in right now?

9. How could your behavior at home, at work, at church, or in your relationships either strengthen or weaken someone's view of the gospel?

10. What is one specific way you can make the gospel more visible through your words or actions this week?
